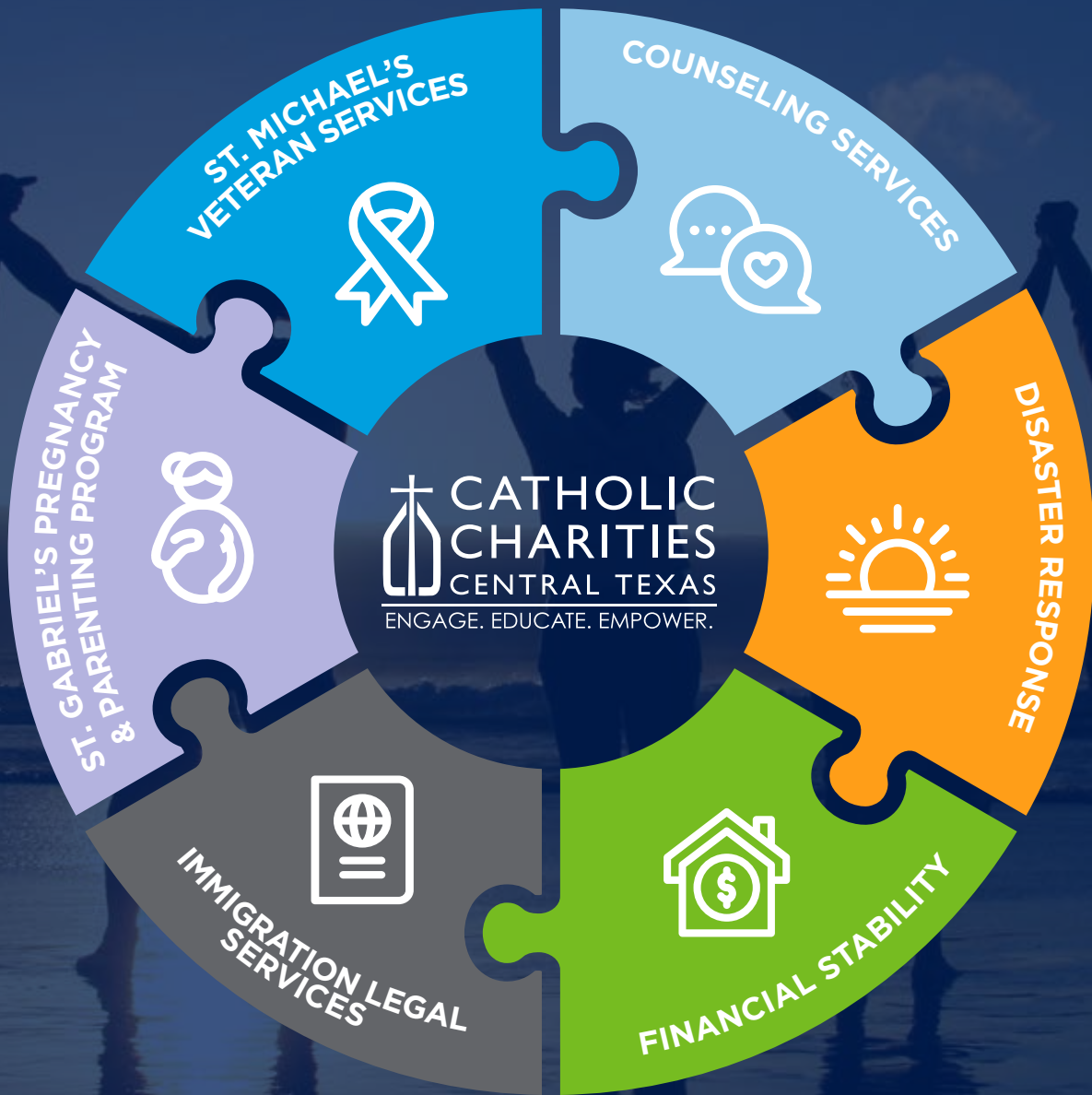

Looking back on the last year, I am proud that Catholic Charities has excelled both in our regular service delivery and in making strides to achieve our larger vision, including:

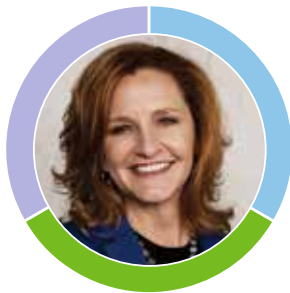
- Increasing internal referrals to help our clients benefit from the many services we offer under the same roof.

OUR PROGRAMS FIT THE NEEDS OF CENTRAL TEXANS



COUNSELING SERVICES

- Conducted 3,104 mental health counseling sessions, an increase of 19% over FY21
- 85% of our clients experienced an overall improvement in their mental health



DISASTER RESPONSE

- Distributed \$141,255 in emergency funding for housing, utility, home repairs, and gift card assistance
- Provided support to 378 individuals impacted by the Texas Winter Storm and the 2022 Central Texas tornadoes



FINANCIAL STABILITY

- Distributed \$1,045,531 in financial assistance to 3,017 clients
- 86% of clients achieved housing stability
- Provided financial education to 740 individuals



IMMIGRATION LEGAL SERVICES

- Assisted 984 clients from 54 countries
- Conducted 984 consultations and represented 605 clients in over 23 different processes, including DACA renewal, removal defense, and renewing permanent residency cases



ST. GABRIEL'S PREGNANCY & PARENTING PROGRAM

- Provided a healthy start to 649 babies and conducted 300 parenting and life skills classes
- Distributed more than 111,000 diapers and other material items



ST. MICHAEL'S VETERAN SERVICES

- Served 318 veterans and dependents across 10 Central Texas counties in our service region
- Distributed \$153,307 in aid to military families

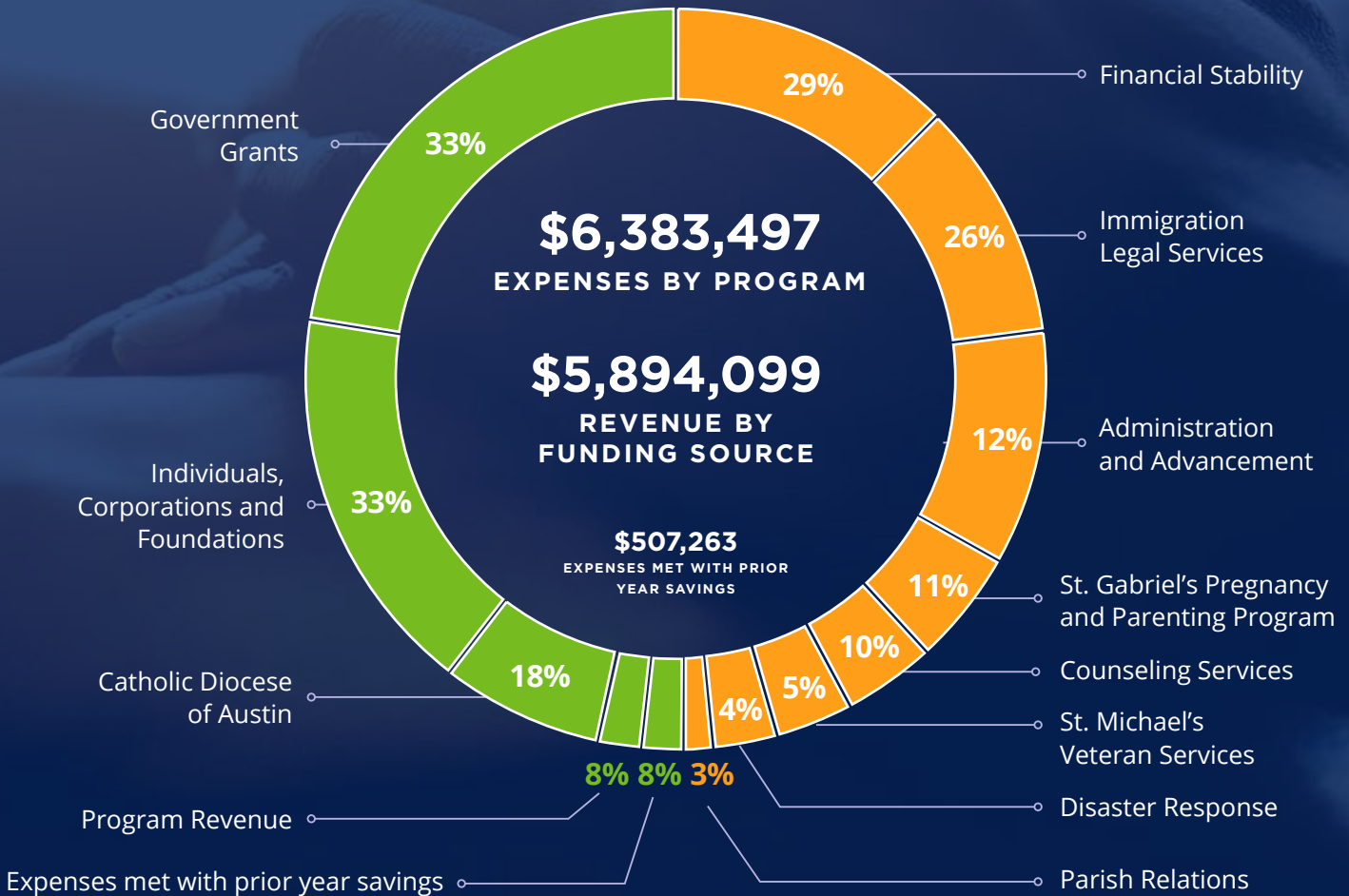

This year, two special clients dug deep to share their stories and the lasting impact Catholic Charities had on their lives. Both have continued to grow and achieve incredible things since coming to Catholic Charities in their time of need. Here's where they are today.

Grace Mulenga

Creating Hope in Central Texas Evening Event, November 2021

When Grace came to Catholic Charities, she was at a crossroads. Catholic Charities helped her keep a roof over her head as she put herself through graduate school. Thanks in part to the help she received from Catholic Charities, Grace earned her MBA, started a successful career in the financial industry, and eventually purchased her first home.

Eight years later, Grace returned to Catholic Charities. This time, she didn't come to ask for help. She came back to pay it forward by donating to Catholic Charities to help someone else in her shoes. She was a keynote speaker at our 2021 Creating Hope event in Austin, where she shared the key role Catholic Charities played in the trajectory of her life and the importance of giving back to help others.

Since her speech at Creating Hope, Grace became a published author. In her book, *Audacious Destiny*, Grace tells of her journey of faith, resilience, and the discovery of God's intentionality. In the future, Grace plans to continue to help and inspire others. "My goal every day is to create hope in whatever way I can," she said.

Creating Hope Luncheon Brazos Valley, April 2022

After being stuck in an abusive marriage for many years, Anna Byrd had lost her will to live. But in a moment of bravery, she decided her life was worth saving. After filing for divorce, Anna started a new life on her own, and began seeing a counselor at Catholic Charities who helped her break through her trauma to become a better version of herself.

With hard work and help from her counselor, she turned a corner. At our Creating Hope Luncheon, Anna shared that she now has a job, purchased a home, is planning her new business, and starts each day feeling blessed.

Today, Anna is continuing to build momentum. She is busy networking and forming a community to help her business thrive. But most importantly, her confidence is growing, and she is setting big goals for the future.

A short time ago, Anna had lost her voice. "Now, every day my voice grows stronger," she said.

PROGRAMS WORKING TOGETHER

How Catholic Charities programs came together to support Afghan refugee families in Austin.

When refugees from Afghanistan began settling in Central Texas, Catholic Charities was quickly called upon to support families in integrating into their new home. Multiple Catholic Charities programs worked together, going beyond their regular operations to fill unmet needs in our community. Here's what we did to help:

- Our **Financial Stability (FS)** program understands that navigating the rental market is difficult for those unfamiliar with our community. FS provided rent and utility support to provide safe and stable housing as these families acclimate to their new home and look for stable work.
- Our **St. Gabriel's Pregnancy and Parenting Program (SGPPP)** helped families who were struggling to access public transportation and did not have adequate resources to provide for their children. SGPPP offered special deliveries of basic needs items including diapers, clothing, strollers, car seats, food, and more to help these refugees live with dignity.
- Our **Immigration Legal Services (ILS)** program offered several legal clinics for Afghan refugees through the Texas Here to Stay coalition. ILS will continue to work with refugee families to apply for asylum or Special Immigrant Visas after these families are settled and have addressed their basic needs.
- **Community partnerships are key** to our ability to tackle large issues and make a big impact. We worked closely with organizations like the Ladies of Charity Lake Travis Chapter to coordinate efforts and help Afghan families thrive in their new home.

Our effort to support Afghan refugee families highlights the key strengths which set Catholic Charities apart in our community:

- Our strong reputation for partnerships that maximize the impact of our efforts.
- Our willingness to go above and beyond regular operations in times of great need.
- Our abundant opportunities for Central Texans to access many support services they need, all under one roof.
